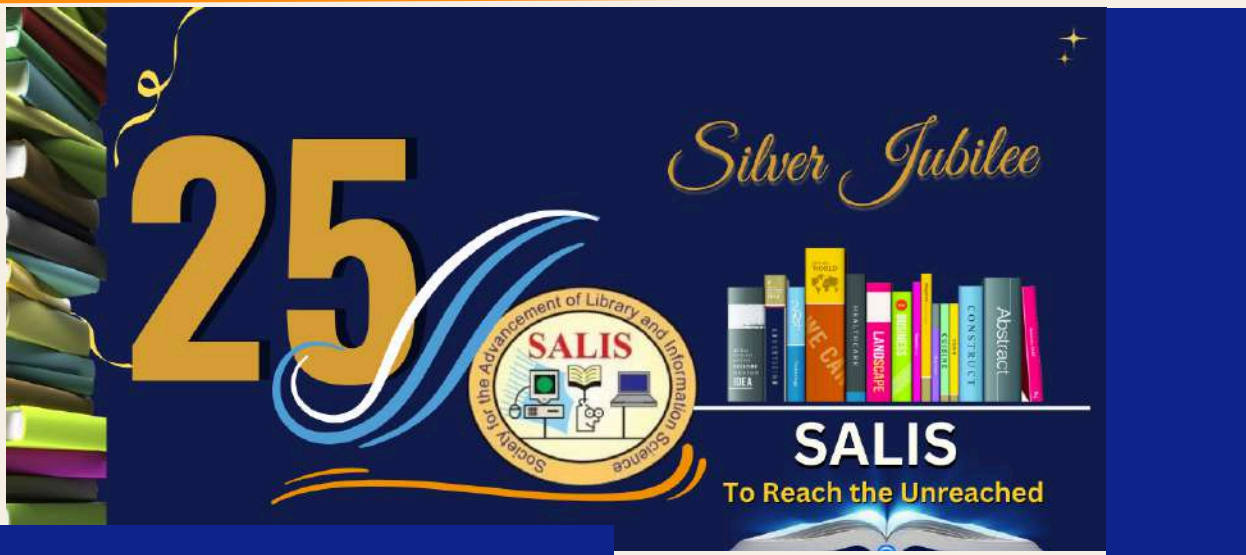

Editorial

Celebrating 25 Years of SALIS – A Journey of Knowledge, Service, Collaboration and Transformation

SALIS was formally started on 2nd April 2002. The Silver Jubilee of the SALIS marks a proud and memorable milestone in our collective journey. Twenty-five years ago, SALIS was founded with a clear vision—to strengthen the library and information profession through collaboration, innovation, and service. Today, as we celebrate this landmark year, we reflect with gratitude on the past, pride in the present, and confidence in the future.



Over the last quarter century, SALIS has emerged as a vibrant professional platform that has consistently worked toward the advancement of library and information science. Through conferences, workshops, seminars, publications, and outreach activities, the Society has played a vital role in nurturing professional competence, encouraging research, and promoting lifelong learning among library professionals. SALIS has not only kept pace with change but has often led the way in embracing new technologies, digital transformation, and evolving user needs.

Chapters and Members:

SALIS has more than 2,000 Life Members and 22 Institutional Members across India and has signed Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with more than 15 institutions to organize events at their campuses. SALIS has established 12 chapters across the country.

Programmes:

Over the last 25 years, SALIS has organized 30 national and international conferences; about 400 seminars, workshops, training programmes, discussions, and lectures; and 90 webinars, in collaboration with more than 75 reputed institutions across various parts of the country, with the aim to reach the unreached and bridge the digital divide.

Publications:

SALIS has published 26 books with ISBNs and two journals. The quarterly SALIS Newsletter reports all events conducted by each chapter and highlights other important professional developments. SALIS also publishes the SALIS Planner every year, which includes useful information and a calendar.

Awards and Honours: SALIS has instituted 19 national and regional awards under various categories and has honoured more than 250 professionals. SALIS has organised several functions to recognise retired professionals, PhD holders, and NET/SET achievers.

Promotion of Reading Habits:

One of the key objectives of SALIS is to promote reading habits in society to help build a knowledge-based community. SALIS has organised numerous programmes in schools, colleges, and public places and has distributed books to children. To create awareness about the importance of reading habits among various sections of society, a large rally was organized simultaneously in Chennai, Coimbatore, Trichy, Madurai,

Erode, Tirunelveli, and Puducherry, jointly with Puthiya Thalaimurai TV, on 15 November 2014. More than 10,000 people participated across these seven cities. A Reading Conclave was organised in collaboration with KSRCT, Tiruchengode, in 2018.

Community Service:

SALIS established a Library and Community Development Centre at Pogai village in Tenkasi District in 2022. In collaboration with the Olirum Foundation, SALIS has operated Smart Kubos (Reading Booths) in two waiting halls at Erode Railway Station and in a public park since 2017. SALIS has also conducted blood donation camps and medical check-up programmes on several occasions.

COVID-19 Relief Activities:

During the COVID-19 pandemic, SALIS distributed food packets, groceries, and basic medicines at several locations in Tamil Nadu and Nellore. SALIS also donated ₹50,000 to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund and ₹1,00,000 to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund, and provided financial assistance of ₹20,000 each to the families of five deceased professionals.

Professional Services:

SALIS has organised numerous programmes to train Library and Information Science (LIS) professionals to update their skills and knowledge in order to meet digital challenges. SALIS has also taken various initiatives to address professional issues by submitting representations and holding discussions with relevant authorities. These efforts include seeking parity in age relaxation for librarians with teaching faculty in AICTE institutions when applying for new posts, reducing the residency period for Deputy Librarians to be on par with teaching faculty, filling vacant librarian posts through TNPSC, and revising the nomenclature of librarians. SALIS has submitted several representations to various

State and Central Government agencies in support of these causes.

Partnership with UNESCO:

SALIS organised a series of programmes in Chennai, Nagpur, and New Delhi, in partnership with and with financial support from UNESCO, to promote awareness of information literacy in 2026. SALIS also created the UNESCO–SALIS e-learning Portal on Awareness Raising in Information Literacy Competency Skill Development for Southern Asia in 2008, with financial support from UNESCO.

Frontier in the Use of Technology:

SALIS extensively uses social media platforms such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and WhatsApp, along with web technologies, for information sharing and communication. The SALIS App, launched in 2020—the first of its kind in the country—facilitates member registration, fee payment, access to certificates, forms, and receipts, and enables quick registration for online meetings and webinars with attendance certificates. Official communications are also shared through the app. The SALIS website (www.salis.in) provides comprehensive information on past activities, members, awards, and publications. The last 25 years have witnessed profound changes in the information landscape—from print-centric libraries to hybrid and digital knowledge hubs, and now to AI-driven systems. SALIS has responded to these changes by fostering dialogue, promoting best practices, and empowering professionals to adapt and innovate. In doing so, the Society has reaffirmed the enduring relevance of libraries as engines of education, research, and social development.

As we celebrate this Silver Jubilee, it is also a time to renew our commitment to the core values of SALIS: professionalism, inclusivity,

collaboration, and service to society. The future presents both challenges and opportunities—emerging technologies, open knowledge movements, and the growing demand for information literacy.

With the collective strength of our members and the enthusiasm of the next generation of professionals, SALIS is well-positioned to continue its meaningful contributions in the years ahead.

National Seminar on “AI Tools Enhancing Academic Research & Library Services

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell and the Department of Library of Sri Kaliswari College (Autonomous), Sivakasi, organised a One-Day National Seminar on “AI Tools Enhancing Academic Research & Library Services” on 28 November 2025. The seminar aimed to create awareness about emerging Artificial Intelligence tools and their transformative role in research methodologies, scholarly communication, information management, and library services.

The programme began with a prayer song, followed by the Welcome Address delivered by Dr. S. Sridhar, Chief Librarian, who highlighted the growing significance of AI in higher education. Dr. P. K. Balamurugan, Principal, delivered the Inaugural Address, emphasizing how AI is reshaping global research ecosystems and the need for capacity building among faculty and students. Dr. L. Radha, Treasurer, SALIS & Librarian, TCE, Madurai, presented a brief overview of SALIS (Society for the Advancement of Library and Information Science). Felicitations were offered by Ms. R. Muthulakshmi, Vice-Principal, Dr. S. Manimekalai, NAAC Coordinator, and Dr. A. Hariharan, Founder-President, SALIS.



Session I, titled “Smart Tools for Smarter Learners,” was handled by Dr. K. S. Kuppusamy, Associate Professor of Computer Science, Pondicherry University. He demonstrated practical AI tools that enhance teaching and research by generating learning materials, offering instant feedback, and supporting literature reviews, encouraging educators to adopt AI responsibly and effectively. In Session II, Dr. Augustine Arul Prasad, Associate Professor of Chemistry, D. G. Vaishnav College, Chennai, addressed on the topic “AI for Higher Educational Practices.” He highlighted how AI personalizes learning through adaptive systems, intelligent tutoring, and content creation, while also cautioning about ethical concerns and the need for balanced human–technology integration. In Session III, Dr. Nataraj Balasubramanian, Assistant Professor and Chairperson, Management Development Programme, Thiagarajar School of Management, Madurai, explored the topic “Business Analytics for Career Success and Employability.” He explained how AI and analytics shape data-driven academic ecosystems, empower research with tools like Scopus AI and ChatGPT, and strengthen employability by building analytical literacy among students and educators. Session IV, titled “AI for Library Services: Some Examples,” was presented by Dr. A. Hariharan, Founder-President, SALIS. He illustrated how AI supports cataloguing, FAQs, book recommendations, chatbots, grammar checks, and data analysis—enabling libraries to automate tasks and improve user support services. The seminar offered valuable insights into emerging AI technologies, practical demonstrations of research and library tools, guidance on ethical usage, and strategies for strengthening academic and information services. The programme concluded with a Vote of Thanks proposed by Mrs. L. Priya, IQAC Coordinator, and a total of 143 faculty members along with 22 students from 19 colleges actively participated and benefitted from the event.

Analog to Digital: The Transformation Workshop on Digitisation, Preservation, and Metadata of Library Materials

A one-day professional workshop titled “Analog to Digital: The Transformation” was jointly organised by the French Institute of Pondicherry (IFP) and the Society for the Advancement of Library and Information Science (SALIS) – Puducherry Chapter on Friday, October 31. The workshop aimed to strengthen professional capacities in the digitisation of library materials, preservation of physical collections, and creation of metadata for digitised resources.

The workshop was formally inaugurated by Dr. K. Elavazhagan, Chief Knowledge Officer, Learning Resource Centre, Indian Institute of Management Tiruchirappalli, and Advisor, SALIS. The inaugural session was graced by Prof. Renaud Colson, Director and Patron, French Institute of Pondicherry; Dr. A. Hariharan, Founder President, SALIS; and Prof. R. Sevukan, Chairman, SALIS Puducherry Chapter. The dignitaries emphasised the growing importance of digital transformation in libraries and cultural institutions.

During the inaugural ceremony, the SALIS Silver Jubilee Logo(2002 – 2027) was formally released by Prof. Renaud Colson, Director, IFP, in the presence of Dr. A. Hariharan, Dr. A. M. Venkatachalam, and Dr. Captain T. Magudeeswaran

The technical sessions focused on key aspects of managing the transition from analog to digital collections, including preventive preservation of physical materials, digitisation workflows and best practices, and metadata creation for enhanced discovery and access. Participants were also introduced to an overview of IFP’s expanding digital collection portal, highlighting the institute’s efforts in preserving and disseminating cultural and research resources through digital platforms. The workshop featured expert sessions by Dr. R. Narenthiran, Mr. K. Ramesh Kumar, Mr. Gopinath Sricandane, Mrs. Anna Poorani, and Dr. Nayana Nair from the French Institute of Pondicherry. The resource persons shared practical insights and hands-on perspectives drawn from their professional experience in digitisation, archival management, and metadata standards.



The valedictory address was delivered by Dr. Vijakumar, University Librarian, Pondicherry University, who reflected on the relevance of such capacity-building initiatives in strengthening library services and supporting research and knowledge dissemination in the digital age.

The workshop witnessed the active participation of over 90 delegates from various institutions across India, including library and information professionals, researchers, academicians, and students, fostering meaningful academic and professional interaction.

The programme concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Dr. G. Saravanan, Organising Secretary and Chief Librarian and Treasurer, SALIS Puducherry Chapter, along with Dr. M. Leeladharan, Joint Organising Secretary, Associate Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Pondicherry University, and General Secretary, SALIS Puducherry Chapter. They expressed their sincere gratitude to the resource persons, participants, and organising team for the successful conduct of the workshop.
